

DEATH OF HENRY M. WITHERS.

As a Boy, He Served in the Confederate Army—Was County and City Attorney.

Henry M. Withers, an attorney, 63 years old, died at 10:20 o'clock last night at his home, 4336 Warwick boulevard. Heart disease was the cause of his death.



Henry Malcolm Withers was born in Warrenton, Va. He was a son of General Pickett Withers and a descendant of a family that came to Virginia in 1640 from England.

When 14 years old he left home and served in the Confederate army. After

the war he was graduated from the University of Virginia. In 1870 he came to Kansas City and engaged in the practice of law. He served one term and part of another as county attorney and one term as city attorney. He was a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress last August.

Mr. Withers was a Mason and a member of the Country club. His wife was Mary Pierce, a daughter of A. H. Pierce of Pierce, Tex. She and two daughters, Lacy and Mary Withers, and two sons, Pierce and Pickett Withers, all of Kansas City, survive him.
