The most common are class participation, written essays, oral presentations and exams. The IE grading scale follows a strict Bell Curve and is distributed as follows: Honors 15% of the class Excellence 35% of the class Proficiency 35% of the class Pass 15% of the class Pass 3.00 Examination, the only possible outcomes are Low Pass or Fail. The numerical valuation of each letter grade is as follows: Honors 4.00 Excellence 3.66 Proficiency 3.33 Pass 3.00 Low Pass 1.00 Fail 0.00 A student receives an Excellence or Proficiency grade when his/her performance is similar to that of the majority of the class.
