

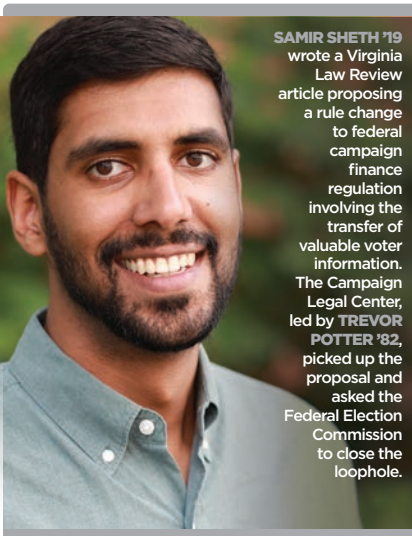


PUBLIC POLICY and Regulation

LAWYERS WORKING WITH PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS must understand the complex relationship between law and public policy to be effective at shaping it.

Virginia's strength in public policy and regulatory law draws from faculty members who have brought their experiences working for the government or other institutions back to the classroom. These connections benefit students in a variety of ways.

When professors work for Congress or federal agencies such as the State Department, volunteer for government commissions, consult for state and local governments, or work with advocacy organizations that seek to influence public policy, the experiences enrich their teaching, facilitate student opportunities to network with practicing attorneys in a variety of fields, and inspire fresh insights in research and scholarship.



SAMIR SHETH '19 wrote a Virginia Law Review article proposing a rule change to federal campaign finance regulation involving the transfer of valuable voter information. The Campaign Legal Center, led by **TREVOR POTTER '82**, picked up the proposal and asked the Federal Election Commission to close the loophole.



Professor **DEBORAH HELLMAN** wrote an award-winning paper, "A Theory of Bribery," that argues an action only amounts to bribery when the things exchanged are of different types.



Professor **SAIKRISHNA PRAKASH** recently testified before the U.S. House Judiciary Committee about presidential power and questions raised by the Mueller report, which was led by Special Counsel **ROBERT MUELLER '73**.

THE LAW SCHOOL'S PROXIMITY to Washington, D.C., provides rich opportunities for a close-up view of how regulations, policies and the government interact. The location also allows top government lawyers and Washington-based practitioners to teach part-time at Virginia, which exposes students to the kinds of concrete issues they may one day face as government officials, practicing lawyers or policy advocates.

J.D.-M.P.P. (PUBLIC POLICY) PROGRAM The Law School offers a dual-degree program with the University of Virginia Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy, in which a student may obtain both a J.D. and a Master of Public Policy degree (M.P.P.) in four years, instead of the five years that would be required if each were taken separately. Students who have been admitted to the program may elect whether they want to start in the Law School or the Batten School.

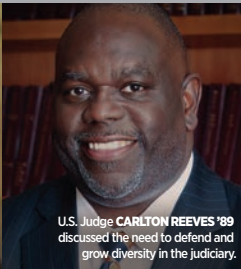

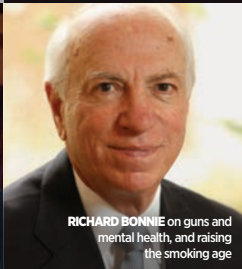
UVA SCHOOL OF LAW PROFESSORS MAKE AN IMPACT IN PUBLIC POLICY DEBATES

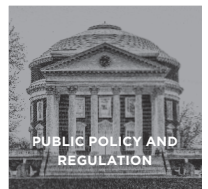
